Topics

This term Year 6 will be studying the following topics:

Literacy – Texts: ‘The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn, Fantasy Stories, a range of non-fiction writing

Maths – Counting, partitioning, calculating, securing number facts, shape and data handling

Science – ‘All Living Things’, ‘Evolution and Inheritance’

Geography– ‘The New World’

History –Britain after World War II 1940’s and 1950’s , A history off the page workshop

Art– Street Art, looking closely at Banksy’s work including a street art tour of London

DT– Limited Food – Rationing

ICT – E Safety, Internet research, We are App

PE– Basketball, Athletics, Residential – Aberdovey (Wales)

RE – Religious Leaders, Religious Beliefs about Life and Death

PSHE (P4C) – Living in the wider world - Culture, Bullying, Ethics and the media

Music – With the help of the Newham Music Academy, Year 6 will be continuing with flutes.

Reading

Your child will be given a new reading book every week, please make sure your child brings in their reading book every day. It is essential that your child reads every day for at least 20 minutes.

Reading doesn’t just have to be their school reading book. Encourage your child to read newspaper articles, comics, library books, recipes or even the back of cereal boxes. As your child’s reading skills develop so will their writing skills. Remember to visit the school library where we have lots of new and exciting books!

In addition to the above, our online reading resource, Bug Club will allow your child to access a range of books online and will directly feed into your child’s learning at school. Please take some time to explore this website. Working together we can improve your child’s reading ability greatly.

Homework

Your child will be given three sheets of homework every Friday: one piece of English; one piece of Maths and one piece of Science/Topic work. Be assured, the homework reflects the learning that has been done in class and is explained to the children every Friday. The homework will have an appropriate level of challenge for your child, if you wish to discuss the homework please come and see us. All homework should be completed in homework books or on sheets and in pencil. Alternatively, it can be e-mailed straight to school. All homework is due in by the following **Thursday**.

There will be a homework club every Tuesday, where your child can come and complete their homework. We urge you to make sure your child attend homework club as the staff supporting them will be able to help with their work.
