English – Pupils will cover : Instructional , letter and a narrative writing. These will involve exciting stimuli and opportunities for short incidental writing with a focus on Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation.

Maths – Pupils will be studying decimals, measurements and percentages. Pupils can use websites such as; www.bbc.com/education or <http://www.primaryhomeworkhelp.co.uk/maths/>
These websites will help pupils to consolidate their learning.

Science – Pupils will be investigating Earth and Space and living things and their habitats.

Creative Curriculum - in DT we will create a rocket using pneumatics, Understand and use mechanical systems in their products (for example gears, pulleys, levers and linkages). In History we will be looking at the Great Fire of London and life after the event.

Computing – We will be using stop frame animation to recreate the Great Fire of London.

RE – We will be looking at understanding what inner forces are and how they affect how we think and behave.

PSHE – We will be thinking about gender stereotyping followed by our SRE topic in Summer Two.

PE– Pupils will be focusing on the necessary skills needed for Football and will have an additional Gymnastics session during Summer term one

Music – Pupils will be learning to play the keyboards every Tuesday afternoon. These lessons will be delivered by the Newham Music Academy.

Spanish - To endorse healthy eating, pupils will be studying imperative verbs by following instructions to make a fruit salad. They will also ask questions such as; 'How much is it?' finding the quantity in price (euro), and talking about their pets .

PE Dates

In year 5 children will be doing PE on Wednesday and Thursday.

Please ensure your child brings their PE kit into school on this day:

Navy blue shorts or tracksuit bottoms and a white t-shirt. Pupils are also required to wear suitable sports shoes and not wear any jewellery.



Homework

Homework is a very important part of your child's education. It is usually linked to what your child has learned that week or in preparation for something they are going to learn. Homework for this term will focus on grammar development.

Your child will need support from an adult to read and fully understand what he/she needs to do. Homework is given to the children Friday and they are expected to hand it in the following **Thursday**. To encourage the completion of homework in a positive way, we will give a reward at the end of each half term, to the children who have completed all homework activities.

From time to time, we will also set the children a project to complete at home linked to the Creative Curriculum or Science. This is a great opportunity for you to work on a fun and creative project with your child.

Note: School provides homework support on Monday after school from 3:15 till 4:15.

Reading—Important Information

Please encourage your child to read for 10 minutes every night.

- Before reading with your child, read his/her target (written in yellow reading record) so that you can help them to achieve their target. We also welcome your responses and comments in the same book.
- The children can also access a range of books online through Bug Club. Your child's log in details will be in their reading log.
- Please ensure that your child brings their reading book to school every day.
- It is also important to share and enjoy books with your child. Remember that books can be borrowed for free from our school library or your local library. Reading books together will help your child to acquire rich vocabulary that will support with writing exciting stories!

Uniform

Please ensure that your child's name is clearly labelled in all of their uniform. Your child should take responsibility for looking after their belongings, particularly in the playground and when changing for PE. If you find you have the wrong item of clothing returned to you, please bring it to your child's teacher and we will endeavour to return the correct items.
