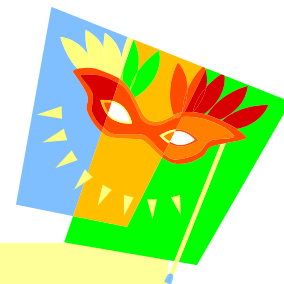

Curriculum Topics

English – Pupils will be preparing for their SAT's (commencing Monday 14th May). After SAT's the pupils will be learning about poetry. They will learn about the features of a seasonal haiku before writing their own based on the seasons.

Maths – Pupils will be preparing for their SAT's (commencing Monday 14th May). After SAT's the pupils will be learning about pie charts, area and perimeter and volumes of solids and liquids.

Science – Pupils will be learning about light, animals including humans and evolution. They will be working scientifically as well as conducting their own investigations based on their research.

Creative Curriculum

Geography – Pupils will contrast and compare England with Brazil and other locations in South America.

Computing – Pupils will make cross-curricular links with art and use the 'We Are App' planners for their project on the Ancient Mayans.

RE – Pupils will visit a local church as their place of worship and learn about Christianity. They will explore how Christians worship and their beliefs.

PSHE – Pupils will learn about developing relationships.

PE – Pupils will be going swimming at Stratford Olympic Park for a 2-week intensive course as part of the Physical Education curriculum. They will also be learning about rounders and the skills/techniques that are involved.

Music – Pupils will develop an understanding of music through History. They will perform and compose music.

Spanish – Pupils will learn about animals, qualities in Spain, the planets and news reporting.

PE Dates

In year 6 pupils will be doing an intensive swimming session after half term.

Please ensure your child brings their PE kit into school on this day:

Navy blue shorts or tracksuit bottoms and a white t-shirt. Pupils are also required to wear suitable sports shoes and not wear any jewellery.



Homework

Homework is a very important part of your child's education. It is usually linked to what your child has learned that week or in preparation for something they are going to learn. Homework for this term will focus on grammar development.

Your child will need support from an adult to read and fully understand what he/she needs to do. Homework is given to the children Friday and they are expected to hand it in the following **Thursday**. To encourage the completion of homework in a positive way, we will give a reward at the end of each half term, to the children who have completed all homework activities.

From time to time, we will also set the children a project to complete at home linked to the Creative Curriculum or Science. This is a great opportunity for you to work on a fun and creative project with your child.

Note: School provides homework support on Monday after school from 3:15 till 4:15.

Reading—Important Information

Please encourage your child to read for 10 minutes every night.

- Before reading with your child, read his/her target (written in yellow reading record) so that you can help them to achieve their target. We also welcome your responses and comments in the same book.

- Please ensure that your child brings their reading book to school every day.
- It is also important to share and enjoy books with your child. Remember that books can be borrowed for free from our school library or your local library. Reading books together will help your child to acquire rich vocabulary that will support with writing exciting stories!
