



Summary of year 6 Views on Safeguarding at Keir Hardie

We asked our year 6 children to tell us what they think we do well as a school to ensure the safety of the children and also what we could do better so that the children feel even safer

What Keir Hardie does well:

- Tackle issues of bullying when they arise
- Have rules that are clearly understood by all and are generally kept by all
- We have regular fire drills and children know the procedure
- Children have badges for highlighting allergies in the dinner hall
- There is a good staff to pupil ratio
- We teach safety in cooking lessons
- We provide information about safe travel – TfL Workshops
- We teach road safety etc through cycle training
- Teaching about risk assessment and taking risks (in Wales)
- Risk assessments for educational visits
- We teach safety around water & swimming – swimming lessons
- We teach about healthy lifestyles – food, dental hygiene, exercise
- SRE lessons & PSHE lessons teach about healthy & safe relationships and risks of substance misuse/smoking etc
- Visit of Chris Preddy gave valuable information about gangs and knife crime
- We teach e-safety and the dangers relating to social media – “need to let our parents know what we are doing online and not have private sites”
- We teach about cyber-bullying
- Children have named adults they trust and can tell if something is worrying them
- Children support each other

What could be better:

- Adults on duty in playground to be more vigilant and more approachable – give time to listen
- More teaching of safe life skills – cooking, using equipment
- Not to be overlooked by people in the flats
