

History Project: Who do you think you are?

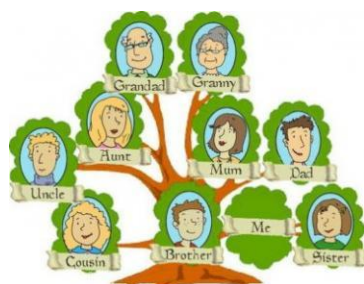

Aim:

Create a family tree

TASK:

Find out as much as you can from one side of your family. This could be either your mum or your dad or, if you find it interesting, both.

Questions to consider:

Who were their parents, your parent's parents and their parents?

Do they have any brothers or sisters?

Who are your uncles/ aunts/ their uncles/ aunts?

Where were they born?

What did they do for a living/ what was their job?

PRESENTATION:

You can present the tree in any form (see some ideas above). Try to go back as much as you can and maybe you can find out who were your great - great - great - great grandparents!!!
