Rationale:

The government has provided schools with Catch-Up Premium to narrow the gaps for vulnerable and disadvantaged pupils due to the pandemic restrictions and lockdowns, which have happened in the last eighteen months. Keir Hardie Primary School is committed to use the money allocated for bespoke interventions for those pupils identified as disadvantaged and not making enough progress compared to their peers. These interventions are run by both class teachers and teaching assistants for English and Maths. Formative and summative assessments form the basis of the identification of pupils as well as pupil engagement during lockdown.

Aims:

- Narrow the gaps between PPG and Non-PPG
- Identify pupils for English and Maths interventions from Pupil Progress Meetings and pupil engagement
- Run bespoke interventions before school by Teaching Assistants and during school by class teachers at set times during the week
- Interventions are set to improve basic skills for English and Maths which supports the National Curriculum
