Attendance

We would like to say a thank you to the parents and carers who have helped to start the academic year by bringing their child(ren) to school every day. The school attendance target for 23/24 is 96%. Let's aim, even higher, to exceed our target!

A couple of important attendance reminders:

- School attendance is mandatory for all pupils
- Leave of absence / holidays will not be authorised during term time
- For any sickness absences / or medical appointments, please ensure medical proof is provided to the school so the absence can be authorised.
- In line with government regulations, if a child's attendance falls below 95% in a term, they will be referred to the Attendance Management Service. If there are 6 unauthorised sessions (1 session = half a day) in half a term, a penalty notice of £60 per parent may be issued.

Working together to improve behaviour

With your support we aim to continue creating a positive culture that promotes excellent behaviour, ensuring that all pupils have the opportunity to learn in a calm, safe and supportive environment.

As a school community, we foster a shared responsibility amongst all staff, pupils and parents, towards encouraging good behaviour and actively discouraging unacceptable behaviour.

Together we can create an environment where all pupils are happy and can learn.

Friendship Friday

On the last Friday of every month we celebrate Friendship! A child in every class is given a certificate for showing good friendship to others. This is important as it shows children the importance of working well with their peers and having strong friendships. Even the Adults get involved by giving certificates to each other. We ask that all children wear Denim Jeans on Friendship Friday- it is not a non-uniform day. We give all children a Friendship T-Shirt to keep in school for Friendship Friday.
