Curriculum

English— children will write an instructional piece and a fantasy. All will involve exciting stimulus and opportunities for short incidental writing with a focus on Spelling, Punctuation, and Grammar.

Maths— Year 5s will be counting forwards or backwards in steps up to a million; revisiting roman numerals; use of the four operations (addition, subtraction, division, multiplying) up to four digits long and fractions.

Science—children will be looking at the properties and changes of materials through exciting investigations and raising questions to develop their scientific skills

History—In history, the children will exploring Elizabethan England and examine what life was like during this period.

Geography—In Geography, Year 5s will develop their field work and geographical skills, they will read maps, use a compass and understand symbols on a map. They will also develop their place knowledge of Maldon when they visit in November.

Art—In art, children will be partaking in an algorithmic art workshop, where they will create digital art following different algorithms.

D&T—Children will design and create a dreamcatcher using a 3D printer. **PSHE**—In PSHE, children will develop their moral and social skills, learning how to manage friendships and develop an understanding of peer pressure.

RE—In RE, children will have time to reflect on what they have to be thankful for and also understand how Christmas is celebrated around the world.

PE— this term, children will develop their basketball skills. They will be able to apply the basic skills suitable to attacking and defending. They will also be doing gymnastics, where they will develop their flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance.

Computing—Children will continue to understand the importance of online safety, they will also become programmers and do some exciting coding. **Music**—Children will be studying rock music, learning about the singing styles, improvisation and playing the C,D,E notes on a keyboard.

Spanish—Children will continue to develop their grammar and pronunciation

Homework

Homework is a very important part of your child's education. It is usually linked to what your child has learned that week or in preparation for something they are going to learn. Your child will need support from an adult to read and fully understand what he/she needs to do. Homework is given to the children Friday and they are expected to hand it in the following Thursday. To encourage the completion of homework in a positive way, we will give a reward at the end of each half term, to the children who have completed all homework activities.

From time to time, we will also set the children a project to complete at home linked to the foundation subjects or Science. This is a great opportunity for you to work on a fun and creative project with your child.

Note: School will provides homework support on a day to be confirmed after school from 3:15 till 4:15 which will start from the week beginning 25th September 2023.



Pupil Support

Some pupils continue to have some gaps in their learning. In order to narrow these gaps, school will provide support for pupils before and after school and during the school day. Your child may be asked to come into school at 8:30 to work on particular areas they find challenging in order to narrow these gaps. The morning sessions are from Monday to Thursday. If your child is unable to attend the sessions regularly, their place will be given to another pupil.

Parent/pupil information

As we do every year, we will be checking with you that all the details we have on our system for you and your child are accurate. It is very important that the information we hold on pupils and parents is up-to-date and correct.

Keeping up to date through Class Dojo

All classes will communicate any messages with you on Class Dojo. If you have not done so, please download the app (both for Apple and iOS phones) and you will receive instant updates on how your child is doing with regards to Dojo points, educational visits and class information.

Please **do not** use Class Dojo to report your child absent or who will collect your child after school. Please inform the office of any absences and speak to the class teacher in person regarding any changes for collecting your child at the end of the day.



Uniform

Please ensure that your child's name is clearly labelled in all of their uniform. Your child should take responsibility for looking after their belongings, particularly in the playground. If you find you have the wrong item of clothing returned to you, please bring it to your child's teacher and we will endeavor to return the correct items. If a coat, jumper or other item is left in the playground, it will be taken to lost property, which is accessible through the school office.
