Curriculum

English: In English, pupils will be following our 'Talk 4 Writing' scheme of work in writing their diary entries based on our class text Goodnight, Mr. Tom' - which is also linked to their history topic.

Maths: In Maths, pupils will be consolidating their learning from KS2 on place value and number, including the four operations.

Science: In Year 6 Science, pupils will use their working scientifically skills to learn how circuits are formed, identify electrical symbols and give reasons for how changes in components affect a circuit.

History: Our history topic is 'Britain in the early 1940's' - pupils will learn how WWII started and finished, exploring and researching artefacts and creating a timeline of key events.

Geography: Our geography topic is linked to our residential visit to Wales - pupils will compare Canning Town (London) to Aberdovey (Wales).

Art: In art, pupils will be practising their painting and printing skills by creating a travel poster/book cover linked to the 1940s.

D&T: In D&T, pupils will use computing programs to combine different shapes to digitally print using a 3D printer.

PSHE: Our PSHE topics for Year 6 include; safe relationships, families and friendships and respecting ourselves and others.

RE: In RE, we will be researching life after death and the different beliefs across religions.

PE: Pupils will learn about the skills and techniques in athletics and basketball.

Computing: Our focus for Year 6 will be online safety and computer science looking at the history of computers and how they are built.

Music Pupils will learn about the dimensions of music including pulse, rhythm and pitch.

Spanish: Pupils will learn how to tell the time, money and everyday

Educational Visits

We are looking forward enhance and enrich our curriculum with exciting educational visits this term. School will continue to subsidise these visits with up to 40% of the total cost. Parents and carers are able to pay large contributions in instalments, to cover their part of the cost. You will be informed of any visits, with a high cost, in advance. Please speak to your child's class teacher if you have any queries. **Year 6 pupils will be leaving for Wales on Monday, 30th October.**

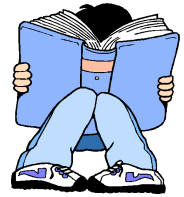


Homework

Homework is a very important part of your child's education. It is usually linked to what your child has learned that week or in preparation for something they are going to learn. Your child will need support from an adult to read and fully understand what he/she needs to do. Homework is given to the children Friday and they are expected to hand it in the following Thursday. To encourage the completion of homework in a positive way, we will give a reward at the end of each half term, to the children who have completed all homework activities.

From time to time, we will also set the children a project to complete at home linked to the foundation subjects or Science. This is a great opportunity for you to work on a fun and creative project with your child.

Note: School will provide homework support on a day to be confirmed after school from 3:15 till 4:15 which will start from the week beginning 25th September 2023.



Pupil Support

Some pupils continue to have some gaps in their learning. In order to narrow these gaps, school will provide support for pupils before and after school and during the school day. Your child may be asked to come into school at 8:30 to work on particular areas they find challenging in order to narrow these gaps. The morning sessions are from Monday to Thursday. If your child is unable to attend the sessions regularly, their place will be given to another pupil.

Parent/pupil information

As we do every year, we will be checking with you that all the details we have on our system for you and your child are accurate. This includes contact numbers, address, emergency contacts and medical details. If there are any changes, then please let us know. It is very important that the information we hold on pupils and parents is up-to-date and correct.

Keeping up to date through ClassDojo

All classes will communicate any messages with you on ClassDojo. If you have not done so, please download the app (both for Apple and iOS phones) and you will receive instant updates on how your child is doing with regards to Dojo points, educational visits and class information. You can also upload any homework or video clips of you and your child working together at home. This is the logo to look out for in the app-store.

Uniform

Please ensure that your child's name is clearly labelled in all of their uniform. Your child should take responsibility for looking after their belongings, particularly in the playground.
