# Safeguarding



### Medication

- Medication must be placed in a clear zip lock bag and clearly labelled with your child's name and clear instructions of dosage to be administered and when
- Asthma pumps will be packed from school. If you know your child's pump is out of date please can you consult your doctor and get a new pump
- Medication will be collected on the day and stored in the medical bag until we arrive
- If your child suffers from travel sickness, please give them a tablet for the outward journey and provide for the return journey.

### Snacks

- We are a healthy school so no unhealthy snacks will be allowed as the pupils are provided with a nutritionally balanced meal, hot chocolate and cookies, packed lunches with water, juice, fruit, snacks etc.
- Breakfast is a hot cooked breakfast, fruit, cereal, yoghurt, toast, juice and much more...
- Dinners are huge and very delicious!

# Deposit and Spending Money

- Each child must give a £10 deposit (notes please). It needs to be placed in an envelop and labeled with your child's name. Please note that the pupils will be loaned equipment for the activities, if they lose any items this will be deducted from the deposit.
- Please speak to your child about taking care of the loaned items and their own personal items
- You can give your child no more than £20 spending money this also needs to be in an envelop and labeled with your child's name and the amount
- This will be collected from your child on the day we leave and placed in the safe.

### Communication

- Parents will be notified upon the arrival
- There is very little signal and therefore communication over mobile phones is difficult
- Children are not allowed to take their mobile phones
- The centre has a landline phone should it be necessary to ring
- Should there be any issues we will call directly from school mobile phone
- Photos of our visit will be updated on the school website and Class Dojo
- Parents should will be informed of the progress of the journey home on Friday, 3rd November, 2023.
